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I understand that:

1. The individual pupil timetable must have **a minimum of 31 and a maximum of 35 periods** per week. Only in exceptional cases may pupils be permitted to attend more than 35 hours.
2. There are three types of courses: compulsory, elective and supplementary. Pupils' individual timetable must have **at least 29 hours of compulsory and elective courses (Columns 1 – 4)**.
3. The examination (written and oral) for each subject should be in the Language and at the level of years 6 & 7.
4. Between years 6 and 7, only the following level changes are possible:
 - Maths 5 ↔ Maths 3
 - 4 period option ↔ Compulsory 2 period (same subject)
 - The change to an advanced subject (Maths 5, 4 period option) depends on successful assessment process, which would prove the pupil's ability to meet the subject requirements.
5. Requests for changes in either language or level submitted at the end of s6 must be accompanied by the consent of the Class Council. They will be reviewed by the Director, who will make the final decision.
6. Pupils who choose a subject in s7 in a different language from s6, due to a change of school between years 6 & 7 or teaching staff shortage, will be examined in the language of instruction in s7. However, upon request, the Director may allow the pupil to be examined in the language of instruction in s6. In this case, a very specific procedure is followed involving the Director, the Subject European Inspector and the European Baccalaureate Unit.
7. If any change of Language 2 is approved at the start of year 6, the previous Language 2 remains the same for the instruction of History, Geography and Economics.
8. All changes must be in accordance with the provisions of applicable administrative procedures.
9. Replacing one option with another is not allowed.
10. It is permitted to discontinue an elective, advanced or supplementary course between years 6 & 7, provided that this is in accordance with the provisions of the applicable administrative procedures and, in particular, the minimum required number of hours, i.e. 31 (at a minimum, 29 hours of compulsory courses, elective and advanced courses + 2 hours of supplementary courses).
11. If pupils choose at least 2 elective courses for their individual timetable and have reached 31 periods, they are not required to choose any additional courses.
12. Elective, advanced or supplementary courses **are not to be chosen** in year 7.
